

Stay safe on the coast

If you or your dog get into trouble at the estuary,
call the Coastguard immediately:

COASTGUARD

Emergency at the coast, call 999
and ask for the Coastguard

If you are deaf or have a speech
impairment, you can send an
emergency SMS.

The Coastguard will then contact
the nearest rescue team to assist
you.

**DO NOT CONTACT THE
RNLI DIRECTLY IF IT IS AN
EMERGENCY – DIAL 999**

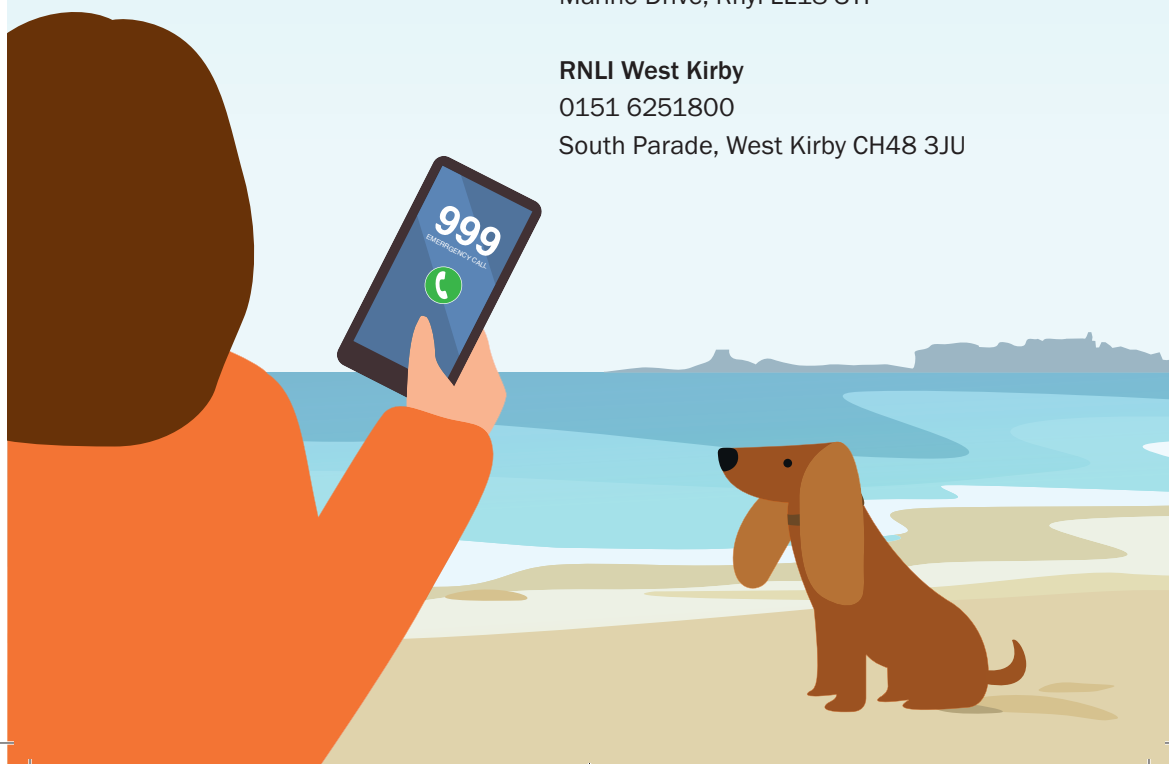
